THIRD SESSION - FIRST LEGISLATURE

REGINA, THURSDAY, APRIL 2nd, 1908.

3 O'CLOCK P.M.

This being the first day of the Third Session of the First Legislative Assembly of the Province of Saskatchewan, for the Despatch of Business, pursuant to a Proclamation of His Honour Edward Ludlow Wetmore, Administrator of the said Province, dated the seventh day of March, 1908, and the House having met, His Honour entered the House and having taken his seat upon the Throne, was pleased to open the Session with the following speech:

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY,—

Amongst the duties that have devolved upon me during my administration of the affairs of this Province owing to the absence of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, none has afforded me such pleasure as that falling to me today, when I am called upon to welcome you to the Third Session of the First Legislative Assembly.

It is very gratifying to be able to congratulate you upon the conditions at present prevailing throughout Saskatchewan and upon the bright prospects for the continued growth and development of the Province. Whilst it is true that the weather conditions of the past season affected the crop production in certain areas, it is a matter for much rejoicing that our Province has come through the year with credit. Our financial standing is unimpaired; our farmers are entering upon the new season with hope; and our prospects generally were never brighter than they are at the present time.

Owing to the scarcity of seed grain of sufficient good quality in certain portions of this Province and the difficulty which our farmers were likely to experience in procuring good seed, my Government thought it advisable to take steps to deal with the matter. All documents relating thereto will be laid before you for your consideration.

Since your last meeting here a very important measure affecting the financial relations of the Province with the Dominion has been passed by the Imperial Parliament. This measure grew out of the proceedings of the interprovincial conference held at Ottawa in 1906 at which representatives of my Government were present. You will, I am sure, be glad to learn that as a result of the measure referred to the annual subsidies paid to the Province by the Government of Canada have already been materially increased and that provision is made for further large increases as the population of the Province continues to grow.

You will have noted with pleasure the steps which are being taken throughout the Dominion to nationalise the historic Plains of Abraham and to celebrate the three hundredth birthday of Canada in a manner worthy of our country and of the Empire.

Your instructions to inquire into the question of the inauguration of a telephone system for the Province, owned and controlled by the people through their Government, have been complied with, and measures dealing with the subject will be submitted to you.

The question of the establishment and organisation of a Provincial University has been receiving the attention of my Government, and I am happy to be able to inform you that, with the exception of the selection of a president, the various governing bodies have been elected or appointed and that the active work connected with the organisation of this important institution may now be proceeded with.

The necessary preliminary steps having been taken by the Federal Government, the Supreme Court of the North-West Territories was dissolved during the past year and the Provincial Courts provided for by your legislation were established on a basis which meets present requirements.

You will, I am sure, be pleased to learn that plans for the new Legislative and Departmental Buildings are practically completed and that the erection of these buildings will be proceeded with at an early date. The construction of a number of other buildings and institutions is well under way. These include Court Houses at Saskatoon and Battleford and Land Titles Offices at Battleford, Yorkton and Regina. Contracts have also been entered into for the erection of a Provincial Gaol at Moosomin and the construction of a Court House at Moose Jaw. These, and a number of other public institutions, are urgently needed, and when completed will do much to assist in the administration of justice and public affairs throughout the Province.

The Commission appointed to inquire into the question of municipal organisation has completed its work and its report will be laid before you. A series of Bills to remodel the municipal institutions of the Province has been prepared and will be duly submitted to you.

A number of measures will be laid before you for consideration, amongst which will be Bills relating to elections, for increasing the representation in the Legislative Assembly, to provide for the free distribution of text books, to amend and consolidate the laws relating to liquor licenses, and a Bill respecting the consolidation of the general laws of the Province.

A statement of the receipts and expenditures of the past year and the estimates of the current year will be submitted to you at an early date, and you will find that the estimates of expenditure have been prepared with a due regard to economy and the requirements of the country.

I now leave you for the consideration of the business of the session, and trust that under Almighty guidance your labours will result in the welfare of the people whom you represent.

His Honour was then pleased to retire.

Mr. Speaker informed the House that in order to prevent mistakes he had obtained a copy of the Speech of His Honour the Administrator, which was laid on the Table.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR:

The Legislative Assembly of the Province of Saskatchewan in Session assembled, approach Your Honour at the close of their labours with sentiments of unfeigned loyalty, and humbly beg to present for Your Honour's acceptance a Bill intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Sums of Money for the Public Service of the Fiscal Year ending the twenty-eighth day of February, 1909," thus placing at the disposal of His Majesty the means by which the Government can be made efficient for the service and welfare of the Province.

"In His Majesty's name, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor doth thank the Legislative Assembly, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill."

His Honour then delivered the following speech:

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY:

It now becomes my duty to release you from the labours of the Session.

I have to congratulate you upon the unusually large amount of highly important and useful legislation, the passage of which has marked the third Session of this Legislature.

The provision you have made for consolidating the Laws of the Province will tend to the better convenience of all concerned, and the important reforms which you have provided in the regulation of the Liquor traffic cannot fail to prove of great benefit in the social and moral conditions of the Province.

The Legislation which you have adopted for constructing and operating Long Distance Telephone Lines by the Government, and for promoting the development of Rural Telephone Service under public control by aiding local Telephone Companies, is calculated to produce excellent results.

Your Act providing for the taxing of the Railway corporations will be of advantage to the public revenues and for the welfare of the Province.

The provision which you have made for a new system of Election of Members of the Legislative Assembly, will I am satisfied, prove an improvement, and the action you have taken towards providing a larger representation of the people in the Legislative Assembly is undoubtedly well justified by the rapidly increasing population of the Province.

The revised Municipal Laws as well as a large number of other measures which you have passed, will I am sure, greatly tend to the better management of the work of my people in many respects.

The prospects for the season of 1908 are exceptionally bright throughout the Province and I trust that the promise of what has been an especially encouraging spring may be fully realised by my people.

I have to thank you for the liberal supplies which you have voted for the public service.

I now take leave of you, earnestly trusting that the Divine blessing may rest upon you, and upon the work which you have done here.

The Hon. Mr. Motherwell then said:

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislative Assembly be prorogued until it shall please His Honour to summon the same for the Despatch of Business, and the Legislative Assembly is accordingly prorogued.
