REGINA, THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 1909.

3 o'clock P.M.

This being the first day of the Second Session of the Second Legislative Assembly of the Province of Saskatchewan, for the Despatch of Business, pursuant to a Proclamation of His Honour Amedee Emmanuel Forget, Lieutenant Governor of the said Province, dated the fifteenth day of October, 1909, and the House having met, His Honour entered the House and having taken his seat upon the Throne was pleased to open the Session with the following speech:

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:

It is my privilege and pleasure to welcome you to the Second Session of the Second Legislature of the Province.

The encouraging prospects of Saskatchewan to which I was able to refer at the time of your last session have been realised during the intervening period to a degree exceeding the most sanguine expectations. The industry of our people in the season now ending has been very abundantly blessed. The estimated aggregate yield of grains shows an increase over former years so remarkable as to attract in a notable manner the attention of the people of other Provinces and countries, and places Saskatchewan in an unrivalled and unchallenged position as the foremost grain producing Province in Canada. An increase from 9,000,000 bushels and 37,000,000 bushels ten years ago and five years ago respectively, to no less than 200,000,000 bushels in the present year, may be truly described as a remarkable record. Our 80,000,000 bushels wheat crop of 1909 exceeds the highest records of any of the States of the American Union excepting only Kansas and Minnesota. Its signifi-

cance has been strikingly illustrated by His Excellency the Governor General who points to the fact that less than one-tenth of Saskatchewan's wheat lands has this season produced a wheat crop rather more than equalling one-tenth of the largest wheat yield of the whole of the United States in any single season. A gratifying feature of recent development is the demonstration that has been made of the suitability for cereal production of a large area of land in the south-western part of the Province, the fitness of which for agricultural purposes had been a matter of some doubt.

The bountiful harvest yields of unusually high grade grain, together with the excellent price which the producers are receiving for it, and the welcome absence this year of the acute traffic congestion which caused serious losses in preceding years, combine to make our staple industry a highly profitable one. An immediate effect in all probability will be seen in the continuance or even an enlargement of the stream of desirable new settlers into the Province whose coming may be expected to enable Saskatchewan to maintain the rapidity of growth to which I have alluded. We have every reason to give humble and heartfelt thanks to Providence for the abundant blessings showered upon our Province.

Good progress is being made by the contractors upon the construction of the Legislative and Executive building, the corner stone of which was laid with impressive and dignified ceremony on October 4 last by His Excellency Earl Grey, Governor General of Canada. I am sure that the people of our Province were delighted that His Excellency, who has won a warm and abiding place in all our hearts, graciously acceded to my invitation to visit us once again and perform this task. It is hoped that one year hence the permanent home of the Legislative Assembly will be ready for occupation. As the work upon the building and its surroundings proceeds, more and more is it recognised that my Government in selecting its location made a wise and happy choice.

Announcement has been made of the completion of the exploratory survey for the proposed railway to Hudson's Bay by the Dominion Government. In view of the urgency which exists for the construction of the road I am sure you will join with me in expressing the hope that actual building operations will be commenced at an early date.

The question of branch railway extension remains the most pressing problem in this Province, and has claimed the almost incessant attention of my Government during the year. An encouraging amount of work has been accomplished by the several railway companies on the programme adopted by you during your last session. Further measures on the subject will be submitted for your consideration.

Amongst other Bills which will be submitted to you is a Bill relating to Public Health, Bills respecting Drainage and Water Courses, a Bill providing for inspection of Factories, a Bill concerning the law of

Libel, and a Bill to enable the granting of Petitions of Right.

Negotiations have been satisfactorily concluded for the acquisition by the Province of the systems of the Bell Telephone Company and the Saskatchewan Telephone Company. In accordance with the policy adopted by you long distance telephones within the Province are now exclusively owned and operated by the Government. Particulars of the contracts will be laid before you.

It is gratifying to note that the scheme of rural municipal government instituted by you at your last session has already been adopted by a large portion of our people, seventy-two rural municipalities having

been formed during the first year of the operation of the Act.

Pursuant to an Address adopted by you on January 11, 1909, I issued my Commission to the Honourable the Chief Justice and the Honourable Mr. Justice Newlands to inquire into and investigate all matters and things pertaining to a certain contract made by my Government through the Commissioner of Education, with the Morang Educational Company, Limited, of Toronto. The inquiry has been held. You will be pleased, I am sure, to know that the findings of the Commissioners have completely vindicated and exonerated the Commissioner of Education and the contracting Company in the matter of accusations which led to the inquiry. A report of the evidence taken and the conclusions of the Commissioners will be presented to you.

During the year the Board of Governors of the University of Saskatchewan decided upon the location of that important institution and preparations are now under way for the erection of such buildings as are urgently required. As a result of the policy adopted by my Government and approved by the First Legislature it is confidently expected that within a comparatively short time the Provincial University will be fully equipped to give instruction in all the higher branches of learning. Provision has already been made for a full Arts course and within the year it is the intention of the University authorities to organise an Agricultural College upon an approved modern plan. I feel confident that you will join with me in wishing this most important state institu-

tion every success in its undertaking.

At a conference held between the Premiers of Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan and the Joint Grain Growers' Executive the establishment of a system of Government elevators for the three Provinces was fully discussed and the proposition was later carefully considered by the three Governments concerned. It was admitted at the conference both by the Premiers and by the members of the Grain Growers' Executive who were present that the scheme could not be carried on advantageously unless a Government monopoly were established. Inasmuch as a very grave doubt exists as to the power of the Provinces to create such a monopoly it was deemed unwise to proceed further with the matter under present conditions and the suggestion was offered that certain amendments to The British North America Act should be secured conferring upon the Provinces the powers which they do not seem to possess. Up to the present the Grain Growers' Executive have not intimated their willingness to join or approve an effort to obtain such amendments.

The accounts for the financial year will be laid before you, and

estimates for next year will be submitted to you.

I now invite your best attention to the business of the session and invoke the Divine blessing on your deliberations.

(c) An additional sum of 10 cents for every teaching day its school is in charge of a teacher holding a valid first class professional or interim certificate issued by the Depart-

ment;

(d) An additional sum of 40 cents for every day its school is open during the first year of its operation; 30 cents during the second year; 20 cents during the third year; and 10 cents

during the fourth year;

(e) An additional sum of 20 cents for every teaching day its school is open provided such district comprises an area 7,000 acres or less; 15 cents for every such day if the area of such district is over 7,000 acres and not more than 8,000; 10 cents for every such day if the area is over 8,000 and not more than 9,000; 5 cents for every such day if the area is over 9,000 acres and not more than 10,000; provided however that such additional sums shall be payable only for the years 1910 and 1911 and thereafter every such district that comprises an area of 8,000 acres or less shall be paid an additional sum of 10 cents for every teaching day its school is open.

2. To every town district—

(a) The sum of 75 cents for every teaching day its school is in operation during the year;

(b) An additional sum of 30 cents for every teaching day its school is open during the first year of its operation and 15 cents during the second year;

(c) An additional sum of 10 cents for every teaching day its school is in charge of a teacher holding a valid first class professional or interim certificate issued by the Department;

(d) An additional sum of 25 cents for every teaching day there is maintained during the year a school or room exclusively for pupils above grade seven provided the daily average attendance of pupils in such room is at least twelve and provided further that all such pupils are permitted to attend the school without payment of tuition or other fees.

Resolved, That it is expedient to provide that out of any moneys appropriated by the Legislative Assembly for the purpose there shall be payable in aid of agricultural societies the following grants subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth. The amount of such grants shall be calculated as follows:

1. To each society whose membership for the preceding year is shown to have included at least one hundred and fifty members who have paid their fees up to the date of the annual meeting the sum of fifty cents for each paid up member up to two hundred;

2. To each society which has during the preceding year held one or more meetings as provided in The Agricultural Societies Act the sum of \$10 for each such meeting but not exceeding two;

3. To each society which during the year 1909 undertook co-operation demonstrations in the growing of crops under the direction of the department the sum of \$5 for each such demonstration begun in that year and satisfactorily carried out but not exceeding ten;

To each society which has during the preceding year held a good rarming competition or competition in standing fields of seed grain or in a ploughing match, at which cash prizes amounting to not less than \$50 were offered, an amount equal to two-thirds of the amount actually paid out for prizes, but not exceeding the sum of \$65;

5. To each society which has during the preceding year held a live stock judging competition at which cash prizes amounting to not less than \$15 were offered an amount equal to two-thirds of the amount actually paid out for prizes, but not exceeding the sum of \$15;

6. To each society which has during the preceding year held a spring stallion show at which cash prizes amounting to not less than \$100 were offered, an amount equal to two-thirds of the amount actually paid out for prizes, but not exceeding the sum of \$135;

7. To each society which has during the preceding year held a seed grain fair or a poultry show or a combined seed grain fair and poultry show at which cash prizes amounting to not less than \$50 were offered an amount equal to two-thirds of the amount actually paid out in prizes, but not exceeding the sum of \$50;

8. To each society and to each board of management of a joint exhibition which has during the preceding year held an exhibition at which cash prizes amounting to not less than \$600 were offered an amount equal to two-thirds of the amount actually paid for prizes.

- (2) The grants payable under this section shall only be paid upon compliance with the following conditions;
- 1. That the total amount of grants payable to any agricultural society shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000;
- 2. That after the fifteenth day of November, 1910, the grants payable in any year to any society which has in such year been in existence for a period of at least five years shall not exceed 75 per centum of the aggregate amount of grants to which such society would otherwise have been entitled;
- 3. That when calculating the date of organisation of any agricultural and industrial exhibition association or joint stock company or other company that has succeeded an agricultural society the date when the society such association succeeds was first organised shall be considered the date of organisation of such association or company;
- 4. That no grant on the basis of membership shall be paid to any other society whose membership does not include at least 150 paid up members;
- 5. That a grant for meetings shall not be paid for meetings for which speakers were provided through the director of agricultural extension work or for any educational meeting if the director of agricultural extension work reports that in his opinion such meeting did not fulfil the objects for which it was called;
- 6. That no grant shall be paid to any society for any exhibition or competition unless all regulations framed by the director of agricultural extension work for the guidance of societies in respect to such have been complied with;
- 7. That when any society or board of management of a joint exhibition holding an annual exhibition has during the same year held a spring stallion show or a poultry show in connection with a seed grain fair or any other exhibition at which prizes are offered for classes similar to those for which prizes are offered at the annual exhibition the prize money paid for such classes at such annual exhibition shall not be included in the amount upon which the exhibition grant payable to such society is based;
- 8. That no grant shall be paid in any year to any society unless all returns required by the Minister respecting the work of such society shall have been filed with the director of agricultural extension work on or before the thirty-first of December in such year;
- 9. That the Minister may withhold payment in respect to any prize offered at any exhibition upon receipt of a report from the director of agricultural extension work stating that in his opinion such exhibition was not calculated to promote the legitimate objects of an agricultural exhibition;
- 10. That no incorporated company that permits voting by proxy or allows more than one vote to be exercised by each shareholder irrespective of the number of shares owned or controlled by such shareholder shall be entitled to any grant for an exhibition held;
- 11. That no grant for holding an exhibition shall be paid to any agricultural society or exhibition company if upon receipt of a report

from the director of agricultural extension work or other official authorised by him to attend and report upon agricultural exhibitions it shall appear that, at any exhibition held under the management of such society or exhibition company there were upon the grounds on which such exhibition was held or within three hundred yards of the same any gambling devices or apparatus for carrying on games of chance or any shows or exhibits of an immoral or obscene nature.

The Standing Committee on Agriculture and Municipal Law begs

to report as follows:

Your Committee on Agriculture and Municipal Law, having heard representations presented on behalf of The Saskatchewan Grain Growers' Association in support of Provincial action in the direction of providing a system of grain elevators in the Province:

And being convinced that the existing conditions respecting the handling of grain justifies action on the part of the Government and Legislature towards realising the objects set forth by The Saskatchewan

Grain Growers' Association:

And having regard to the admittedly numerous and intricate

details involved in the solution of a problem of such magnitude:

Begs to report to the House a recommendation that a Commission should be appointed by the Government for the purpose of making searching inquiry into proposals looking to the creation and operation of a system of elevators to effect the objects outlined by the Grain Growers' Association and to report its findings with all convenient speed so that action may be taken to give relief during the coming grain season.

Ordered, That the Report be now received.

On motion of Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Langley,

Ordered, That the consideration of the Report be deferred and stand on the Order Paper for today.

Mr. Whitmore asked the Government the following Question:

Mr. Speaker then said:

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR:

The Legislative Assembly of the Province of Saskatchewan in session assembled, approach Your Honour at the close of their labours with sentiments of unfeigned loyalty and humbly beg to present for Your Honour's acceptance a Bill intituled "An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Sums of Money for the Public Service of the Fiscal Years ending respectively the twenty-eighth day of February, 1910, and the twenty-eighth day of February, 1911," thus placing at the disposal of his Majesty the means by which the Government can be made efficient for the service and welfare of the province."

The assent to this Bill was announced by the Clerk of the Legis-

lative Assembly in the following words:

"In his Majesty's name His Honour the Lieutenant Governor doth thank the Legislative Assembly, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill."

His Honour then delivered the following Speech:

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:

It now becomes my duty to relieve you from your attendance at the present Session of the Legislative Assembly, and in doing so I desire to express my belief that your deliberations and the work you have accomplished during the Session will in the time to come prove of great value to our Province.

Your legislation providing more adequate means for protecting the public health both generally and particularly in the case of women and young people employed in factories, and for the establishment of drainage districts where necessary, indicates your zealous care and interest in the public welfare, which is by no sense lessened by the action you have taken in pressing upon the Federal authorities the importance of the questions of providing railway facilities for the transportation of our products to the shores of Hudson's Bay and for the more effective control of grain storage in the interest of our farmers by taking over and operating the terminal elevators. The authority you have given to my Government to institute an inquiry into the practicability of providing for greater local control of the grain trade, by the establishment of an independent system of elevators, is but one other evidence of your desire to bring about the best possible conditions surrounding the work and lives of the people of Saskatchewan.

In the same connection I might also mention the support you have given to the efforts being made by my Government to bring about a solution of the question of railway transportation in the Province. The branch lines projected to act as feeders to the several transcontinental systems will all serve to relieve difficulties that acutely affect many

settlers in this Province.

I observe that your interest in public affairs is not entirely confined to those more particularly affecting our own Province, but has also been given to the affairs of the Dominion in their relation to those of the Empire at large. I shall have much pleasure in seconding your representations in the matter of the promotion of the efficiency of our naval protection.

GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY:

I thank you for the liberal provision you have made for the public service which shall be most carefully administered for the public good.

Let us earnestly hope that the present bright prospects for the future may be amply realised, and that all manner of blessings may be the lot of our people not only in the present but through the years to come.

The Hon. Mr. Motherwell then said:

MR. SPEAKER AND GENTLEMEN OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislative Assembly be prorogued until it pleases His Honour to summon the same for the despatch of business, and the Legislative Assembly is accordingly prorogued.
